Dearly Beloved,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

September 07, 2025, Fourth Sunday after the Feast of Assumption **Scriptural Readings:**

OT: Exodus 3:1-2, 11-14, Job 1:1-5, Isaiah 1:16-20

NT: 1 Peter 2:1-5, 1 Corinthians 3:16-23, Holy Gospel St Mark 6:1-6

Holy Evangelion, St Mark 6:1-6

6 He went away from there and came to his own country; and his disciples followed him. ² And on the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue; and many who heard him were astonished, saying, "Where did this man get all this? What is the wisdom given to him? What mighty works are wrought by his hands! ³ Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense^[a] at him. ⁴ And Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor, except in his own country, and among his own kin, and in his own house." ⁵ And he could do no mighty work there, except that he laid his hands upon a few sick people and healed them. ⁶ And he marveled because of their unbelief. And he went about among the villages teaching.

Reflections:

God is the source of all wisdom and knowledge. Jesus is the Son of God, the Logos (Word) that became flesh. St John refers to His coming to the world as the coming of the eternal light who has been illumining everything. He assures that everything came through Him and without Him nothing was created. He is the light in every created entity - inbuilt and active. He is the light that glows everything.

The element carbon has light hidden within it. This light is not easily seen but is revealed in due course when carbon turns into diamond while yielding to high pressure and heat within the earth crust. Coal and diamond are different uninterchangeable forms of carbon. Coal is carbon with impurities whereas diamond is without any impurity. Coal is easily found on the earth's surface whereas diamond is formed at a depth of several hundred miles below the earth's surface.

Jesus is the pure diamond that comes from the core and crust of the Father. They share the same essence as the Holy Spirit. In their 'ergos' (work) they play different roles, as the Creator, Sustainer and Perfector though they co-work in everything. It is like a family where each member has a role and purpose, and nobody's work is less or more. All work with one

mind and heart for the survival, development, creation, sustenance, growth and perfection of the family.

To the world, Jesus was the son of Joseph and Mary, an ordinary man born to a carpenter couple. The world thus expected only minimal wisdom from Him. Joseph realized Jesus' divine origin only through the angelic revelation. However, Mary had firsthand knowledge of this mysterious incarnation. Jesus' words, actions, and revealing of His various miraculous powers stumbled them. They didn't know how to receive Him, how to approach Him and how to perceive Him. Hence, they thought, He was possessed by an external force called Beelzebul - demonic and destructive in nature. They were fearful to allow Him into their vicinity with His mysterious power.

As humans are created in God's image and likeness, they all have the divine wisdom within them. Jesus was so clear in saying, "If you believe in me and you abide in me and let me to abide in you, you will do more things than what I have been doing." He was speaking the truth as He knew the potential of every human. With the same potential they could become a leader, guru, scientist, researcher, skilled in various works, warrior, miracle worker, carer, politician, saint, martyr, artist, or performer. If, however the skills were honed otherwise, they could impact society negatively. It depends on how one develops the talents God gave so freely if within a nurturing environment.

God is the giver of wisdom. Wisdom can be used or misused depending on one's intention and goal. Both the leaders and members of the society failed in using their wisdom for the right reasons. It was easy for them to attribute His extraordinary knowledge and miraculous power to demonic forces rather than to understand Him closely and in person. It took less effort to taunt and crucify Him rather than to follow Him with more effort and patience when He would reveal Himself more to the world. If we observe, we will notice that Mary and Joseph used their wisdom for the right reasons, though they did not speak or act in public as Jesus did. Before anyone could even sense His potential, Mary knew of it and hence asked Him to attend to the problem at the wedding house in Cana. Jesus said, "To those who have more will be given, and they will have in abundance, but from those who have not, even what they have will be taken away." (Mt 13:12, Lk 19:26). If God given wisdom is not used for the right purpose, it will be counted as no wisdom without value. Here the 'those who have not' refers to misusers or abusers of wisdom. Faith goes hand in hand with wisdom. Where faith abides, miracles thrive. But faith requires a blind belief in Christ with much persistence. The crowd lacked persistence. They relied on their own logic and reasoning, refusing to let go of their age-old beliefs, hence Jesus could work no miracle in His hometown.

Saul used his intelligence and knowledge to do many things which brought him Roman

citizenship, power and authority, fame and high profile with which he tortured the early believers. His skills were about to be taken away and emptied. It was when he got a revelation from Christ that humbled him to the point that he needed an anointing to regain his sight, he started using his wisdom rightly. Then onwards he made a shift from his old views and wrote a new phase in history with his preaching and ministering the Lord. His skills, power and wisdom abounded. The closer he walked with Christ, the more he turned away from the ways of the world. Saul transformed to Paul. When we use our wisdom in accordance with God's will; we would become rich in divine power and abilities. We get transformed and we will be able to transform the world for its best. This is our calling; to remain in His image and likeness and thus become what our Creator made us for.
