¹⁹But when Herod died, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, saying, ²⁰“Rise, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child’s life are dead.” ²¹And he rose and took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. ²²But when he heard that Archelaus reigned over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there and being warned in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee. ²³And he went and dwelt in a city called Nazareth, that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled, “He shall be called a Nazarene.”

Reflections:

Joseph was a man of vision. When he was in a dilemma of whether to accept or reject Mary after knowing about her conception before their marriage, it was his vision that guided him to accept Mary. The dilemma was replaced by his decision to stand by her when faced with societal challenges. When the life of the child was under Herod’s threat, God sensed Joseph’s fear and again sent an angel to Joseph. Thus, visions played a big role in the journey of the Holy Family.

Without vision, no mission would be accomplished. When we talk about a life with vision, it does not mean a life free from problems. All the great visionaries and missionaries lived their life through severe challenges and hard situations. They had to work hard, fight, sweat a lot, attempt repeatedly, taste failures of great magnitude and often felt all alone in the arduous path that they chose to tread due to the dreams they were not prepared to give up. Being convinced about the visions they had received, they moved on working hard. Every time they fell, they got up and kept going. *They believed that whatever they were going through and whatever they were attempting to achieve had a purpose not limited to personal or familial significance, but rather universal.* They were not selfish. Their vision of their own life was more inclusive. They fought against the world for the best of the world. If they spoke against systems, governments or rulers, it was for the wellness of everyone.

Mary bore the child for the entire world. She knew whom she was carrying and for whom all her son came. Joseph knew his role in the great redemptive initiative by Heaven, and he took it to his heart. All the apostles and prophets were aware of their role in transforming the wider world. Hence challenges and hardships sounded meaningful to them. *Whoever hears and accepts God’s calling would understand that they are called for a greater life with greater moments.* Whenever faced with hardships or big challenges, there would be inbuilt solutions and possible results with divine providence. They would need to look for it with more diligence as the mission progresses. If the focus shifts to problems and the divine guidance is missed or neglected, panic and losses would result.

The assurance, “Fear thou not, for I Am with thee” must be the miraculous mantra one should

have. We submit our life to God's mission, stay aware of the challenges and sense the Lord's forever presence with us everywhere. Let us resolve to work hard and to expect God's miraculous intervention anytime. *With Him, we become victorious. In the new year, we rededicate ourselves and walk with the Lord! What a friend we would have in Him!!*
