Holy Gospel: St Luke 1:1-25 **Luke's salutation to Theophilos**

1 Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the things which have been accomplished among us, ² just as they were delivered to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word, ³ it seemed good to me also, having followed all things closely^[a] for some time past, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent The-oph'ilus, ⁴ that you may know the truth concerning the things of which you have been informed.

The Birth of John the Baptist Foretold

⁵In the days of Herod, king of Judea, there was a priest named Zechari'ah, ^[b] of the division of Abi'jah; and he had a wife of the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. ⁶And they were both righteous before God, walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless. ⁷But they had no child, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were advanced in years.

⁸ Now while he was serving as priest before God when his division was on duty, ⁹ according to the custom of the priesthood, it fell to him by lot to enter the temple of the Lord and burn incense. ¹⁰ And the whole multitude of the people were praying outside at the hour of incense. ¹¹ And there appeared to him an angel of the Lord standing on the right side of the altar of incense. ¹² And Zechari'ah was troubled when he saw him, and fear fell upon him.

¹³ But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechari'ah, for your prayer is heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. ¹⁴ And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth; ¹⁵ for he will be great before the Lord, and he shall drink no wine nor strong drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb. ¹⁶ And he will turn many of the sons of Israel to the Lord their God, ¹⁷ and he will go before him in the spirit and power of Eli'jah, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, to make ready for the Lord a people prepared."

¹⁸ And Zechari'ah said to the angel, "How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is advanced in years." ¹⁹ And the angel answered him, "I am Gabriel, who stand in the presence of God; and I was sent to speak to you, and to bring you this good news. ²⁰ And behold, you will be silent and unable to speak until the day that these things come to pass, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled in their time." ²¹ And the people were waiting for Zechari'ah, and they wondered at his delay in the temple. ²² And when he came out, he could not speak to them, and they perceived that he had seen a vision in the temple; and he made signs to them and remained dumb. ²³ And when his time of service was ended, he went to his home.

²⁴After these days his wife Elizabeth conceived, and for five months she hid herself, saying, ²⁵ "Thus the Lord has done to me in the days when he looked on me, to take away my reproach among men."

Reflections:

For the people of God, the temple was everything to them. They never had a life without the temple facing eastward since its completion and dedication by King Solomon in 957 BCE. As long as the temple was standing there intact, the people could go and offer sacrifices for all occasions in their life. There were sacrifices for thanksgiving, for absolution of sins, for healing, for solving problems, for addressing various issues including foreign invasions. Invaders destroyed the temple a few times: Nebuchadnezzar destroyed it in 587/586 BCE, rebuilt it modestly in 515 BCE; Antiochus Epiphanes desecrated it in 167 BCE, and the Maccabean revolt recaptured it, cleansed and rededicated soon. Herod started rebuilding the temple in 20 BCE to complete and rededicate it after 46 years. This Herodian Temple stood during Jesus' time. It was destructed in 70 CE. Whenever the temple was destroyed, the people were concerned about its rebuilding. They were able to do it each time except for the last destruction. To date, the temple is not rebuilt. It is expected to take place at the coming of the Messiah. The people hit their heads on the Western Walls – which remained after the destruction, and they lament for the rebuilding of the city and the Temple. Throughout the Bible, the relationship between God and worship stood as the decisive factor of life. Whenever the people of God moved to a new place on their journey from bondage to liberation, they took with them - the tabernacle, the mobile temple. With it they entered the promised land and settled there. This tabernacle was later built as the Temple. Everything in the tabernacle was placed reverently in the temple: the Arc of the Covenant, Tablets of Ten Commandments, the urn of Mannah, Aaron's budded rod, cherubim of glory.

We are on the move always. Wherever we go, we carry our faith and the temple. Whoever constructs the temple needs to know that it is God's Temple where the Shekinah stands as the revelation of the Glory of God. It is where the mercy seat is found. It is where we see the Lord appear, as revealed in the Book of Revelation, it is the heaven on earth with unceasing praises of angels and eternal sacrifice of the Lord offered by human hands. Everything in our life needs to be connected to the temple. Whenever we enter the temple, our prayer should be; 'O my Lord God, in reverence I enter your house to offer myself to you as a thanks offering, and to participate in your heavenly banquet. Kindly forgive me, kindly accept me and bless me.' The prayer offered by a deacon would be, 'I will go to the Altar of the Lord and to the presence of God who rejuvenates me.' The hymn prior to public celebration has these lines: 'By Thy light we see light....' To this light we enter. Through this light we see everything. To this Altar we are connected. It is where we present ourselves day by day. The Altar is the witness to everything that happens in our life. Like the disciples went out to preach and returned to Christ to detail Him about everything that they said, did and experienced, we come back to the altar every Sunday (at least) to tell Him what we said, did, and experienced. It is where we feel accountable. When we go for 'kaimuthu' at dispersal, we kiss the hands or cross that touched the Body and Blood of Christ and also present ourselves in front of the open sanctuary, bowing down in front of the Altar to say, "Lord, My Savior and my Redeemer, for whom You have shed your blood and suffered death, here I am, only by Your Grace. You are my All. Without You I have nothing, I am nothing, I can do nothing. I don't know when I will come back to you again. Please be with me as I go my way. Be with me always as you remained with the disciples. I am your disciple and child." As Zachariah got the revelation, we also receive revelations from the Sanctuary. The prayers and incense offered are for us and by us. What we receive would be the glorious presence of the Lord. The altar speaks to us more than we know. The psalmist says, the Lord is my shepherd, I shall not

want'.' Likewise, whenever we stand in front of the Altar, we say daringly and with faith and

conviction: 'I shall have no fear, I shall not go depressed, I shall never give up in life, I shall do everything with my Lord, I shall not perish. I shall never go astray, I shall never doubt, I shall never feel disconnected.' *The Altar would be our personal shelter and refuge*. No evil shall come near to our tents. Our children will be protected by being connected to the Holy of Holies and to the Holy Shekinah. Glory, Glory, Glory be to Him!
