Dearly Beloved,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

October 05, 2025, Third Sunday after the Feast of the Cross, Season of the Cross Scriptural Readings:

OT: Genesis 42:18-21, Proverbs 1:2-9, Jeremiah 31:7-9, Isaiah 54:1-4

NT: Acts 7:2-5, Romans 8:9-17, Holy Gospel St Luke 16:1-13

Were brought to him that this man was wasting his goods. ² And he called him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Turn in the account of your stewardship, for you can no longer be steward.' ³ And the steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, since my master is taking the stewardship away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴ I have decided what to do, so that people may receive me into their houses when I am put out of the stewardship.' ⁵ So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he said to the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' ⁶ He said, 'A hundred measures of oil.' And he said to him, 'Take your bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty.' ⁷ Then he said to another, 'And how much do you owe?' He said, 'A hundred measures of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, and write eighty.' ⁸ The master commended the dishonest steward for his shrewdness; for the sons of this world^[a] are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than the sons of light. ⁹ And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous mammon, ^[D] so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal habitations.

¹⁰ "He who is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and he who is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. ¹¹ If then you have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, ^[c] who will entrust to you the true riches? ¹² And if you have not been faithful in that which is another's, who will give you that which is your own? ¹³ No servant can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon." ^[c]

Reflections:

When God created Adam and Eve, they were given a blessed life to live with all fullness and joy and were assigned with responsibilities and duties. God blessed them by saying, "grow and multiply". Gifts of Spirit were given to them to develop themselves to the maximum. Nothing should have stood as hindrance to their growth other than natural challenges. Disturbances and distractions remained at a minimal level as they were closely connected to God and the rest of creation which harmonized their life and rhythm. The seamless connection among everything meant that they were in union with nature, humans, animals, plants, birds - all of creation – in one beautiful accord. What human called became their names, which means, there was no barrier of language between them. The rainbow of harmony revealed on the firmament after the flood was here which already existed as life's

reality. There was no exploitation or distrust until the sin and fall. Man and woman were assigned with the responsibility of tilling and keeping. It was the keeping of everything that God had created. They had to keep the inventory with proper updates. Nothing had to be lost or mismanaged. They were the stewards of the universe.

An act of greed and disobedience gave way to discord. They got disconnected from the rest of creation and alienated from God the Creator. For reinstating them to the lost stewardship, the Only Begotten Son had to incarnate and to identify with their fall, consequences, sufferings, death and to resurrect everything to a new life.

Here in the parable of the wicked steward, we see a servant who fooled his master by exploiting the master's resources and treasure for his greedy ambitions. He was into a life so unbecoming for a faithful servant. Why was he given the responsibility earlier? Probably because, he was honest and committed in his early years of work but eventually had fallen into selfishness. Satan might have crept into his thoughts to convince him to abuse the trust that the master had in him, to replace his master and to become the owner of everything. The servant now wanted only money and wealth for his pleasures. By drifting away from his duties, he was doing injustice to the ones given unto his care. They had no voice for their rights. Because he was in power and might, everyone was silenced with his cunningness. This parable mentions about the way he tricked the master's dealers. He met them to alter the debt account and receipts. The master commented about the servant's shrewdness in saving himself from termination and imprisonment. It was almost like the sin and fall of Adam and Eve. For saving this wicked steward, the Son of God had to shed His blood on the Cross, to suffer and to die.

Jesus took everyone's sin upon Him and died to resurrect for everyone. It is not mentioned whether the reinstated steward lived the rest of his life in honesty, or whether he was given more responsibilities. The moral of the story is - the love the Lord has for His creation and to what extent He would go to save them.

We may complain about what is given to us. Less or more, the mystery is that, if we are dutiful and committed to God and serve Him without drifting away, we will be given more, as blessing, graces, gifts, wealth, prosperity. The world may have different ideas about how to prosper and achieve more. In that sense, the world can be the tempter giving false or fancy ideas. If we yield to such, the divine protection plan may change or expire, not from God but from our deviation. We are the ones changing the provider, not Him. The Lord is loving and caring. We need to love Him and to reach out to Him. We are here to live harmoniously by being dedicated stewards, taking care of God's treasure and talents, continually reconciling with our fellow beings and with the rest of creation, tilling and keeping and enjoying the fruit of the Spirit. Our paradise cannot be lost. Because He has earned us through His blood, we should thankfully and joyfully live and win.
