Dearly beloved,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ!

Sunday, February 06, Fifth Sunday after Danaha Perunnal Epistle Readings: Acts 9:10-21, 2 Corinthinas 4:1-6 Holy Evangelion, St Mark 1:12-20

^{1.12} The Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. ¹³ And he was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels ministered to him. ¹⁴ Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of God, ¹⁵ and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel." ¹⁶ And passing along by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net in the sea; for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you become fishers of men." ¹⁸ And immediately they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹ And going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets. ²⁰ And immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants, and followed him.

Reflections:

Not all sources of temptation are bad. Temptations can be challenges and if taken, can help the person to build up life further. A warrior should never fear war. A student should never fear exams. A sailor should never fear the waters and winds. If a test helps in self-building up, it can better be viewed as driven by the Spirit of God as it has been written here in the Gospel text. The Holy Spirit guided Jesus and Satan tested him. What could it mean? God is good. He cannot act evil. He guides to situations where a person can weigh his or her credentials, probabilities and possibilities. Satan is none other than inclinations of the human mind which tends to yield to certain longings or preferences. They can vary depending upon each individual's internal tastes, desires and dreams. Kids cry for chocolates because they crave them. Nowadays chocolates have given way to mobile phones and tablets! Inclinations can become real hazards in life. They can block progress by diverting attention to unwanted or unnecessary things. One should have a strong will to remain on track. When life's goal and focus give way to temptations, one can end up an addict, anti-social, bankrupt, broken, unwanted or destructive. Winning over temptations can make one a saviour and successful. The Church is aware how it helps one overcome situations and hence lent is advocated. Let there be more victors than the defeated. God is with us!

February 02, Maeltho, Entrance of the Lord into the Temple (St Luke 1:22-39)

All first entries anywhere have their own meanings. Here it was the Lord's first entry into the Temple. It became revelatory through the words of two senior citizens Simon and Hannah who were in the Temple. Their words came true in the life of the child. Entering a sacred space, meeting someone there, interactions we may have, messages we receive there, the way we find the place and the place finds us, altogether can play a pivotal role in our life.

February 02, HG Pathrose Mar Osthathios Metropolitan, 54th anniversary, entombed at Carmel Dayara, Kandanad

HG Pathrose Mar Osthathios was like St Paul to gentiles. He preached Gospel to the poor, served the needy in the society and specially cared for the outcaste or untouchables. His mission among the less privileged became an eye opener to many who belonged to the higher class. Thirumeni's gospel work turned to be the church's mission in later years. People from other faith communities who were treated as lower caste accepted faith in Christ and got accepted to the Christian community. New churches were built for them. Thirumeni used to carry food stuff and other house necessaries on shoulders or overhead while visiting their houses. Through his words of care and supply of necessaries, the needy could enjoy their daily bread as it is said in the Lord's Prayer!

February 03, Mar Bar Sauma

Fifth Diptych calls Bar Sauma the 'Chief of the Mourners'. The term might not be pleasing to the present era. We find more heroism in violence and use of force. In the early church, disciples were exceptions in the society. They lived differently to prove the wrongs of the popular culture and lifestyle. Many got attracted to their exceptional living. Mourners were a community who chose to live a life of penitence and lamenting over the lost values and unkind luxuries. They spoke less. Their silence and sobs transformed many lives.
