Dearly Beloved,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ!

Third Sunday of Great Lent - Healing of the Paralysed – Mark 2:1-12

God has His wonderful ways for reaching His people. Humans have their ways to access God. When both come together, miracles happen!

Here in the text, we could see Jesus either on a house visit or at a house prayer like we have on weekends. Because of His Charismatic presence, a huge crowd came into the house. The hosting family had no control over the count of people who were stepping in. There was not even a ‘pin-space’ left in the rooms. Late comers had to stand outside. Imagine if it happens in any of our houses while conducting prayer meetings! We prefer to have manageable attendees.

Where the Lord is, things unexpected could happen!

It was just a gathering of families and friends. They never knew anything was about to happen that could leave them in awe! Word of God was preached there. It points to the possibility of wonderful things to occur. Four people dared to carry a paralysed man who has been on bed for years. Human attempts of faith can cause God to act on lives and situations. They didn’t wait for a provision to get open, rather they made a provision. It was quite unlikely for people to enter a house from the top. But they dared to do it. It was a ‘breaking-in’! What made them to take that risk and the blame of unauthorised entry? Mark the writer says, it was their strong faith.

Rights, Duties, Responsibilities: We would always be aware of our rights- both citizen rights and ecclesial rights. We claim them and never feel anything unreasonable about it. The Government, State, Judiciary and the law system would always affirm it. But what about our duties and responsibilities? How much we keep ourselves dutiful? As members of the Church, what we really contribute towards the progress and growth of it? How much we get involved in bringing healing to people through acts of our faith like the four friends we see in this Gospel text? It is not the life of an average church goer Christ expects of us. He would be more keen on faith brought into actions. We even simply refrain from attending prayer meetings. We should think more on what benefit others would have through our presence and prayer. At workplace, public place, public space of movements and transportation, various gatherings and popular spots of visits, everywhere we could act as tools for God to intervene into situations. In short, because of our strong faith in God, miracles could happen!
