Dearly beloved,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ!

June 12, First Sunday after the Feast of Pentecost

Epistle Readings: Acts 17:10-15, 2 Corinthians 5:14-6:9

Holy Evangelion: St Luke 7:27-35

²⁷ This is he of whom it is written, 'Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, who shall prepare thy way before thee.' ²⁸ I tell you, among those born of women none is greater than John; yet he who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he." ²⁹ (When they heard this all the people and the tax collectors justified God, having been baptized with the baptism of John; ³⁰ but the Pharisees and the lawyers rejected the purpose of God for themselves, not having been baptized by him.) ³¹ "To what then shall I compare the men of this generation, and what are they like? ³² They are like children sitting in the market place and calling to one another, 'We piped to you, and you did not dance; we wailed, and you did not weep.'

³³ For John the Baptist has come eating no bread and drinking no wine; and you say, 'He has a demon.' ³⁴ The Son of man has come eating and drinking; and you say, 'Behold, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' ³⁵ Yet wisdom is justified by all her children."

Reflections:

This text conveys two aspects of human presence in the world.

First - is the idea that a person is sent to the world by God with a mission and purpose. John was sent to prepare the way for the Messiah, to prepare the ground for salvation. Jesus was sent by the Father to redeem the whole creation. Likewise, we are also sent by Him. If we look at the preparation before our birth, our early years and our progress until now, we can see this divine planning in the backdrop. For each of us, there was a plan, a purpose and a path. For Jesus' arrival, John prepared the way. For us - who was there to long for us, to wait upon and to guide? And, for whom are we preparing now?

The second aspect is of acceptance. John was a unique and strong ascetic. Jesus too; however, he blended with the local life and culture. The leaders rejected them both. Accepting an idea, person, thing, or situation in its right and true form can be decisive. If rejected, it does not yield any good result.

The comment made by Jesus is worth understanding. "But wisdom is justified by all her children" (Lk 7:35). According to Rabbinic tradition, wisdom is the way of God. It is more personified. The Greek term is Sofia. Wisdom is a mother whose portions are there in each of us. It is the human will that decides whether to use it or not. Whoever uses wisdom, their subsequent actions will prove the reason and significance of it. Wisdom is freely given from above, for us to fully utilise. Religious leaders in Jesus' times also had wisdom, but they couldn't use it for the right purpose. They failed in recognising the Messiah and God's will. In them, wisdom became barren. We all have wisdom given by God. Being His children, we cannot let it go futile. A word of support can go a long way. Many useful projects have been aborted by not using wisdom.

How can we be ready to discern, spot and accept good in anyone, in anything? About us, how will the Lord respond?

This day is called Golden Friday because of the announcement made by Peter “Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk.” Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man’s feet and ankles became strong. He jumped to his feet and began to walk.

This was the apostolic mission. To enable everyone to walk. The man who got healed was lame and was pushed to begging. We are aware that there is organised begging in certain cities. It is another form of mafia and is coordinated as a business. People either join it on their own or are dragged into it by a corrupt system. Those who beg will get only a menial share and the major collection will be taken away by the companies involved.

In the post Pentecostal days, observing of this day is highly significant. When somebody receives Holy Spirit, their world gets transformed. All other riches and positions become insignificant. What the person holds - will be Christ, nothing else. He is all that we need. Peter asked the lame to look at them. What is a believer expected to hold for others? Attires can deceive. It will be too bad to appear in assuring clothing and being unable to meet people’s expectations.

The name of Christ is so powerful. There have been situations in the past which proved the futility of monetary and material richness. Money and power can’t always bring healing or any required transformation. Jesus said, “Without Me, you can do nothing.” St Paul said, ‘with Christ, everything is possible. Were they lying? Have we ever noticed, when people look unto us with certain expectations, and if we fail them, their reaction?

The very name of Jesus Christ is transforming. Let us abide in Him, be healed and start healing others.

We have a Cor Doctor!

We have a doctor here in our village. He came from Tamil Nadu around 1985. A local resident gave their outhouse for his clinic. Since then he has been our local doctor. We do remember his struggle in the initial years to speak in Malayalam. He managed to learn the vernacular fast.

For the last 40 years, he has been serving our local community. What qualities we could see in him? He is accessible to everyone anytime. If there comes a case of emergency, he would accompany them to a nearby hospital, meeting the doctors there, discussing about the condition and possible treatment. He is not greedy. He takes only a minimum fee and the medicines given will be affordable to everyone. He was the only practitioner within our vicinity. If he wanted to make money, he could have easily done it. He is a good listener, patient enough to accommodate all kinds of patients. We have never heard of any mistakes made by him or by his staff in all these years. Despite his experience and years of service, his fee continues to be nominal. His findings and diagnosis have never failed. The medicines he administers, always assured the best of healing one could expect in a short time.

We had always thought, this village is too dependent upon his service and if anything happens to him,



who will be taking care of it just as he did. Yesterday when we met- I had a consultation- he said that his daughter is doing her medical training in Europe. He plans for her to take charge once she finishes her studies. Such is his commitment and dedication towards the community he has been serving. It is the perfect follow-up by engaging his own child to look after his flock.

We have heard of Malayalee doctors serving in northern states taking a minimum fees and serving the local needy. News media usually bring them to world's attention through their reporting. Here we have an efficient doctor from another state, serving this community without any huge profit. He has become our Cor Doctor and we have become his people! (Cor in Greek means village. Cor Episcopa means village bishop).
