Dearly beloved,

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ!

Sunday, December 26, Sunday after the Feast of Nativity

Epistle Readings: Acts 16:6-10, 1 Corinthians 10:1-13

Holy Evangelion, St Matthew 2:9-15, 19:23

2. 9 When they had heard the king they went their way; and lo, the star which they had seen in the East went before them, till it came to rest over the place where the child was. 10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy; 11 and going into the house they saw the child with Mary, his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. 12 And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way. 13 Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there till I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." 14 And he rose and took the child and his mother by night, and departed to Egypt, 15 and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, "Out of Egypt have I called my son."

2.19 But when Herod died, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, saying, 20 "Rise, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead." 21 And he rose and took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. 22 But when he heard that Archelaus reigned over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee. 23 And he went and dwelt in a city called Nazareth, that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled, "He shall be called a Nazarene."

Reflections:

The sacred history of the world says that communities have been guided to destinies by God. Whatever happened in history was made possible by the Divine Will. For the Magi, there was a comet. For the shepherds there were angels. For Mary, Elizabeth, Zachariah, and Joseph, they had visitations or visions. For Moses, it was the fire in the bush. For the Israelites, it was the plagues, pillar of fire and cloud, and the Arc of the Covenant. For the early church, it was the tongues of fire. For all the liberation movements and scientific inventions, certain sheer incidents lead to situations.

As we look at our own life, we could see certain guidance working in situations. Our coming to Canada also happened through certain external interventions. As faithful people, we could sense how the Divine intervention guided us to this moment, to this land, to this phase of life. If the star had a purpose, all signs in our life also have purpose. Let us be convinced that our life is purposeful and intended. May the Holy Spirit guide us further.

Feasts:

December 20, St Ignatius Nurono

St. Ignatius was the bishop of Antioch. He was thought to be the child whom Jesus called near and blessed (Matthew 18:2, 19:13-15). It has been believed that Ignatius had a vision of heavenly fiery hosts praising Hallelujah standing in rows and he was called 'Ignatius the Fiery'. It was him who said,



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‘Eucharist is the medicine of immortality and an antidote to death.’ He loved the Lord and died for his faith, torn apart by lions.

We all are held by the Lord through Holy Baptism. The Lord has touched and blessed us when we were formed and born in our mother’s womb. How are we going to testify to Christ?

December 21, Martyrdom of St Thomas

St. Thomas came to India in search of us. He died for us. He reflected Christ through his life. His death was not of despair or defeat but hope and victory. The Lord has won through the life and death of His Apostle. As successors to this legacy, we are here to follow up. It will not be that easy. But by the Grace of God, we will be able to do it. May the feast of the martyrdom of the Apostle strengthen us in witnessing Christ.

December 23, Fr N K Koruthu Malpan, 20th anniversary, entombed at Vadavukodu Church

Njarthaankal Koruthu Malpan Achen was a soft-spoken, really loving, pious, gentle, and meek person. He was a teacher who radiated positivity through his tender smile and honest interactions. He taught Syriac hymns and tunes (Ekkara- eight ragas of Syriac chanting) at Pazahaya Seminary. His beautiful voice still reverberates in the hearts and ears of all his students - most of the bishops and priests are his pupils.

December 25, Feast of Nativity (Yaldo Perunnal)

December 25 could be the most beautiful day in our memory. We loved it. We enjoyed it. We smelt it. We enthused the night fire during the Liturgy. We loved the procession in the early morning- usually we had the Christmas liturgy starting at 02:00 am! All will have lighted candles for the procession, we all carry the frankincense too for offering to the fire. Saying aloud the hymns of the angels ‘As the angels and archangels on high in heaven sing praise.

(Melppetta uyarangalil swargeeya maalaakhamaar sthuthiykunnathu pole..), we go around the fire, watching the flames flying high, feeling the heat and offering the incense, sensing the sweet aroma of the Magi’s gift, we felt Christ with us. He was in the fire, or he was the fire!

Here, in the new era, we are here in Canada to revisit our olden days. As we carry the faith through our childhood liturgical practices, let our kids receive the Lord through the liturgical gathering. Let us come together to join the heavenly angels, shepherds, and the Magi in praising His Nativity and offering the best we have.

Salute to Sri P T Thomas

Sri P T Thomas, 71 years, the Congress Working President and MLA of Thrikkakkara, has passed away. People in the State of Kerala, irrespective of political differences, offered an emotional farewell. He was one of the best parliamentarians who always spoke convincingly on issues. He stood for environmental protection and ecological conservation. He was a voracious reader and an excellent orator who voiced for social justice and against corruption. He was a secularist who always maintained a healthy relationship with people of all strata. He had asked for his funeral arrangements that no flowers to be offered, only the beautiful Malayalam song ‘Chandrakalabham chaarthiyurangum theeram’, sung by K J Yesudas, written by Vayalar Ramavarma, and music by G Devarajan be played and that his remains should be cremated. After V N Gadgil placed his commission report regarding the conservation of Eastern Ghats, P T Thomas stood with the recommendations and raised his voice in all forums to bring awareness. Saying no to flowers was the last gesture of his commitment to the preservation of nature.
